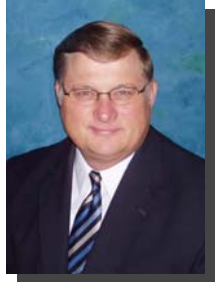

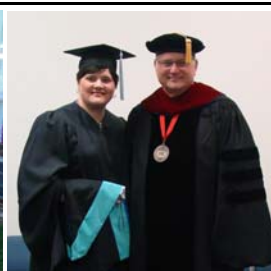

Tim explained to me that he wants to make missions a part of the summer Children's Program at Tabernacle. The group will raise at least \$150.00 to help **Charlie and Julie Luther** with a special project in Ghana, W. Africa. This is exciting because the children will become involved in mission giving. They will learn the importance of missions around the world. Each student will have a part and share in the victory. The issue is not how much they give but that each one will be a part of the whole.

That is how missions works. Each missionary does his part and the job gets done. The work accomplished may be large or it may be small. We must never forget that God is ever present in the small things. He honors the faithful labors of all His missionaries. I was present in a missions conference in a very large church and controversy surfaced when some missionaries felt others were bragging about the number of converts they had. Those who were serving in Muslim countries had gone for some years and had very few or no converts. A very wise Pastor rose to remind all that being faithful in doing your job is the important thing. He went on to remind all of us that bragging is wrong, equally wrong is the "poor me" attitude.

I trust that you are comfortable with the fact that you are doing what God wants you to do for missions. If you are on the mission field and are faithfully serving God and obeying His will, you should be at peace. The measuring stick has never been what someone else is doing. It is what does God want me to do or give?

We have finished our Missions Conference, and it was a wonderful time of challenge and blessing. We all learned more about missions. Our hearts were moved by the longevity of some and the desire of others to get to the field. The job of Tabernacle is to pray, give, and help in every way so that our ministries be successful and glorify God.

The Faith Promise Giving is ahead of schedule. By the grace of God I believe we will reach the \$150,000.00 goal for 2110-2011. With one Sunday left in June, we have \$147,285.00. Praise the Lord for making all this possible. We were able to give monthly increases to those on the foreign field. This means that each one has gotten a raise this year. The Church also voted to give \$6000.00 in varying amounts to nine missionary projects. We added World Wide New Testament Baptist Missions to our support list. Again, we praise the Lord!

To God be the glory for the great things He has done through the people of Tabernacle. Let's pray, work, and give that the message may go around the world.
